

Call for Student Posters and Papers

Submission Deadline: By 5:00 PM, September 29th, 2017

ArPA always values student participation at the Fall Conference! Student participation has been phenomenal over the years! As we did last year, ArPA would like to expand student involvement in the conference. In addition to graduate and undergraduate student posters that will be displayed all day on Friday, it is with great pleasure that we invite graduate students of psychology and related disciplines to submit their research for review and two papers will be chosen to present during the conference. We are very excited to learn about all of the wonderful graduate research being done in the state! This is an excellent opportunity for a graduate student to present his/her research at a conference, build his/her CV, and engage in scholarly dialogue regarding research. Students are welcome to submit papers based on thesis/dissertation projects, collaborative research with faculty, and other research projects completed through coursework.

GRADUATE STUDENTS: **Please submit either a poster or paper presentation.** Please do not submit the same project as a poster and paper; however, you are welcome to submit two different projects – one poster and one paper. Theoretical papers will not be considered for the paper presentations.

Procedures for Submitting Undergraduate and Graduate Student Poster Proposals

Each proposal must include the following information:

- 1) Title of presentation
- 2) Authors' names, classification (e.g., undergraduate or graduate student, faculty mentor), affiliation (school and department)
- 3) Mailing address, telephone number, and e-mail address for first author
- 4) A one or two page summary (500 words max) – meta-analyses and research proposals will be considered for the posters

Procedures for Submitting Graduate Student Paper Presentation Proposals (2 will be selected)

Each proposal must include the following information:

- 1) Title of presentation
- 2) Authors' names, classification (e.g., graduate student, faculty mentor), affiliation (school and department)
- 3) Mailing address, telephone number and e-mail address
- 4) A one or two page summary (1,000 words max) with brief, but clear information regarding:
 - Background information outlining the rationale for the study
 - Methods (participants, measures used)
 - Main findings
 - Brief conclusions/implications

Selected ArPA members will review each poster and paper submission. Two graduate students will be selected to present at the conference for 30 minutes each. The paper presentations will take place on Friday afternoon.
